What is Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD)?

ABCD encompasses building capacity within a community to strengthen the community's assets. This approach focuses on the community's strengths instead of its problems and needs.

Why is ABCD important?

"ABCD allows the full perspective of what a community and its residents can do with their strengths combined... After inventorying assets, a community can more readily begin to **form coalitions**, **collaborative relationships**, **and leverage their social capital to accomplish their goals."**
